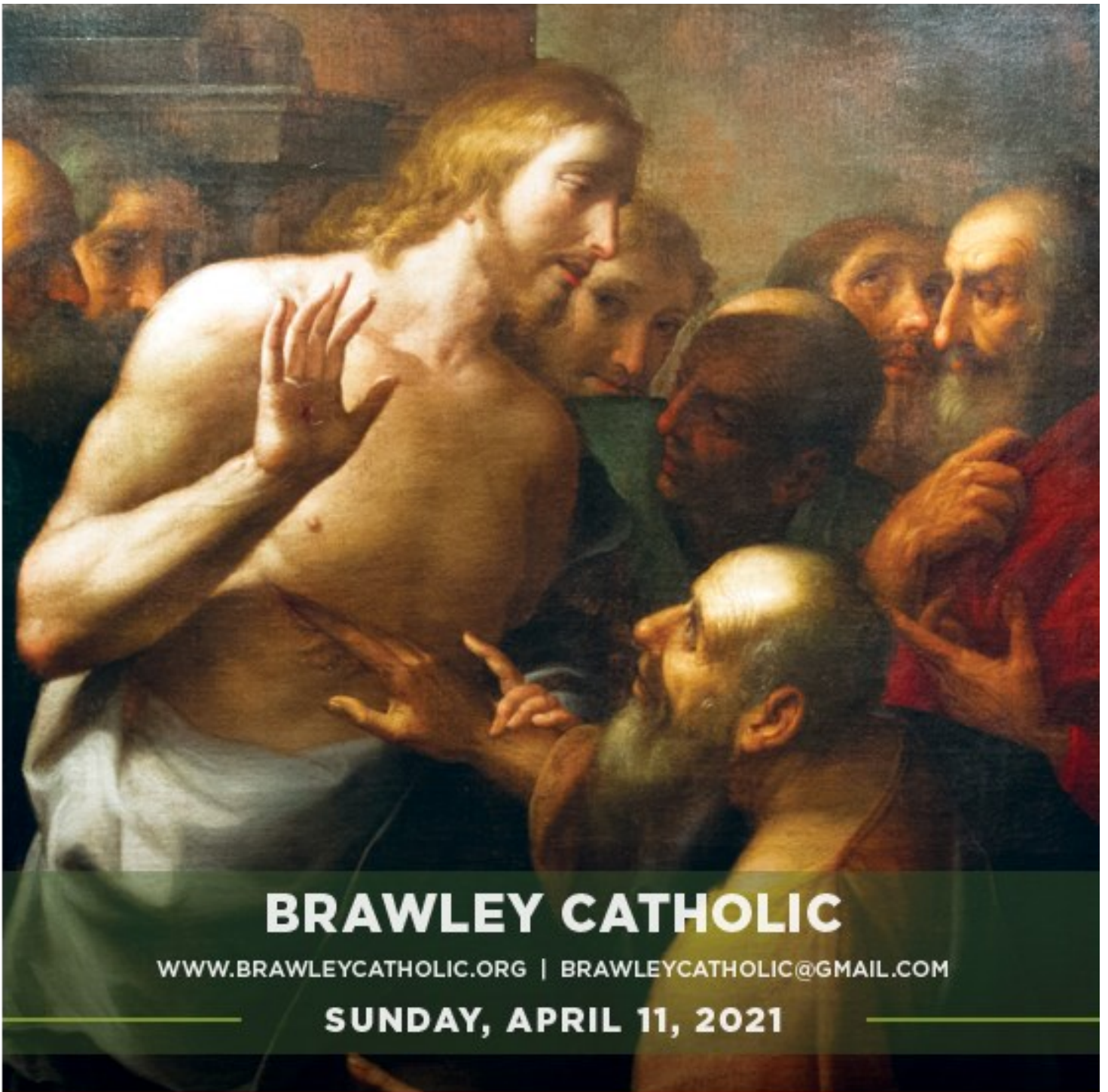

Divine Mercy Sunday * Domingo de Misericordia



Thomas answered and said to him, " My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him,. " Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." - Jn 20:28-29

Dear Catholic communities of Brawley and Westmorland:

Happy and blessed Easter! What a joy it should be for us to announce this message: Christ is risen! Alleluia! This news needs to go out to every house and every family, especially where the suffering is greatest, in hospitals, in prison. Most of all, may this good news enter every heart, for it is there that God wants to sow this Good News: Jesus is risen, there is hope for you, you are no longer in the power of sin, of evil! Love has triumphed, mercy has been victorious! The mercy of God always triumphs! This Sunday evening concludes the octave of Easter – the first 8 days of the Resurrection season. We will continue to celebrate the Lord's Paschal Mystery for 42 more days. The Easter season lasts 50 days!! The world would have us believe that God is so loving that no matter what we do, in the end, everybody is going to Heaven. Let's examine what the Son of God said: "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad that leads to destruction, and those who enter through it are many. How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few" (Matt 7:13-14). Someone asked him, 'Lord, will only a few people be saved?' He (Jesus) answered them, 'Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough' (Luke 23:23-24). What would we know about Christ were it not for the Church? We would not know the real Jesus. We would be following a figment of our imagination. Jesus is real and His Bride is the Church. We come to know the merciful Jesus and the fullness of what He really said and what he really teaches through the Scriptures and the teachings of the Church. Beware therefore that you do not form your opinions on the passing fads and attitudes of the world and strive to live God's plan for humanity.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday – a relatively new feast commemorating an ancient reality – that our God is merciful! "The Feast of Mercy should be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and remission of punishment due to sin. [Our Bishop has told us that our Lenten confession is valid for the reception of this grace so long as we have not committed mortal sin] On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, (Jesus) even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will I contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy." (*Diary of St. Faustina: Divine Mercy in my soul*, 699) *We will have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 11:15AM to 4PM; Confessions from 12PM to 3:30PM.*

Indulgences - The doctrine and practice of indulgences in the Church are closely linked to the effects of the sacrament of Penance. What is an indulgence? An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead. In plain English, it's a "get out of purgatory free card" – however if you apply it to yourself, you lose it when you commit a sin. My suggestion: Don't waste it... apply it to a poor soul in purgatory. Those who participate in the Divine Mercy can obtain a plenary indulgence! **A plenary indulgence** is granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!"); *A partial indulgence, granted to the faithful who, at least with a contrite heart, pray to the merciful Lord Jesus a legitimately approved invocation.*

Queridas comunidades Católicas de Brawley y Westmorland:

Espero en Dios que estén bien. ¡Feliz y bendita Pascua! Debe ser una gran alegría anunciar: ¡Cristo ha resucitado! Que esta buena noticia llegue a todas las casas, a todas las familias, especialmente allí donde hay más sufrimiento, en los hospitales, en las cárcel. La Buena Nueva a través de nosotros llegue al corazón de cada uno, porque es allí donde Dios quiere decirnos <Jesús ha resucitado, hay la esperanza para ti, ya no estás bajo el dominio del pecado, del mal. Ha vencido el amor, ha triunfado la misericordia. La misericordia de Dios siempre vence.> Esta noche concluimos la octava de la Pascua – los primeros 8 días después de la Resurrección. Continuaremos celebrando la Pascua de nuestro Señor Jesucristo por 42 días más – 50 días de fiesta gozando en la victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte y el pecado. El mundo nos haría creer que Dios es tan amoroso que no importa lo que hagamos, en fin, todo el mundo se va al cielo. Examinemos lo que el Hijo de Dios dijo: “Entren por la puerta angosta, porque ancha es la puerta y espacioso el camino que conduce a la ruina, y son muchos los que pasan por él. Pero ¡qué angosta es la puerta y qué escabroso el camino que conduce a la salvación! y qué pocos son los que lo encuentran (Mat 7:13-14). “Alguien le preguntó: «Señor, ¿es verdad que son pocos los que se salvarán?» Jesús respondió: «Esfuércense por entrar por la puerta angosta, porque yo les digo que muchos tratarán de entrar y no lo lograrán»” (Luc 13:23-24) ¿Qué sabríamos de Cristo si no fuera por la iglesia? No conoceríamos al verdadero Jesús. Seguiríamos una invención de nuestra imaginación. Jesús es real y su Novia es la Iglesia. Llegamos a conocer el Jesús misericordioso y la plenitud de lo que realmente dijo y lo que realmente enseñó a través de las Sagradas Escrituras y las enseñanzas de la Iglesia. No sigan la corriente del mundo en que vivimos, sino más bien transfórmense a partir de una renovación, viviendo el plan de Dios para toda la humanidad

¡Hoy es el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia – una nueva Fiesta en la vida de la Iglesia conmemorando una realidad anciana – la misericordia de nuestro Dios! “En todo el mundo, el segundo Domingo de Pascua recibirá el nombre de Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Una invitación perenne para el mundo cristiano a afrontar, con confianza en la benevolencia divina, las dificultades y las pruebas que experimenta el género humano. Jesús a través de Sta. Faustina dijo: Quien se acerque ese día a la Fuente de Vida, recibirá el perdón total de las culpas y la remisión de la pena temporal debido al pecado. [Nuestro Obispo nos ha dicho que nuestra Confesión cuaresmal basta para recibir la indulgencia de esta Fiesta. No hay necesidad de ir otra vez si no se ha cometido pecados graves.] Ese día están abiertas las entrañas de Mi misericordia. Derramo todo un mar de gracias sobre las almas que se acercan al manantial de Mi misericordia. El alma que se confiese y reciba la Santa Comunión obtendrá el perdón total de las culpas y de las penas. En ese día están abiertas todas las compuertas divinas a través de las cuales fluyen las gracias. Que ningún alma tema acercarse a Mí, aunque sus pecados sean como escarlata. Mi misericordia es tan grande que en toda la eternidad no la penetrará ningún intelecto humano ni angélico. Todo lo que existe ha salido de las entrañas de mi misericordia. Cada alma respecto a Mí, por toda la eternidad meditará Mi amor y Mi misericordia. La Fiesta de la Misericordia ha salido de mis entrañas, deseo que se celebre el primer Domingo después de Pascua. La humanidad no conocerá paz hasta que no se dirija a la Fuente de Mi misericordia.” (Diario 699) Tendremos exposición del Santísimo Sacramento de las 11:15AM a las 4PM; y Confesiones de las 12PM a 3:30PM.

Indulgencias - la doctrina y la práctica de las indulgencias en la iglesia están estrechamente relacionadas con los efectos del Sacramento de la penitencia. ¿Qué es una indulgencia? Una indulgencia es la remisión ante Dios de castigo temporal debido a los pecados cuya culpabilidad ya ha sido perdonado; el Católico cristiano fiel que debidamente dispuesto a través de la acción de la iglesia que, como el Ministro de la redención, distribuye y aplica con autoridad el tesoro de las satisfacciones de Cristo y los Santos. Una indulgencia es parcial o plenaria según lo quita ya sea parte o la totalidad del castigo temporal debido al pecado. Los fieles pueden ganar indulgencias para sí mismos o aplicarlas a los muertos. Para entender mejor, es un "salir de Purgatorio tarjeta gratuita –" si se aplica a sí mismo, se lo pierde cuando comete un pecado. Mi sugerencia: Aplíquela a una pobre alma en el purgatorio. ¡Quienes participan en la misericordia divina pueden obtener una indulgencia plenaria! Tal vez no la guarde para sí mismo porque con el primer pecado cometido, se la pierde. **Las indulgencias plenarias** - *Las condiciones habituales (confesión sacramental, comunión eucarística y oración por las intenciones del Sumo Pontífice) otorga una indulgencia plenaria a los fieles que, en el segundo Domingo de Pascua o más bien llamado “el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia en cualquier iglesia o capilla, en un espíritu que esté completamente separado del afecto por el pecado, un pecado venial, participar en las oraciones y devociones en honor de la Divina Misericordia, o que, en presencia del Santísimo Sacramento expuesto o reservado en el Sagrario, recitar el padre nuestro y el credo, añadiendo una devota oración al Señor Jesús misericordioso (por ejemplo misericordioso Jesús, en Ti confío!”); Una indulgencia parcial, concedida a los fieles que, al menos con un corazón contrito, ruegue al Señor Jesús misericordioso una invocación legítimamente aprobada.*

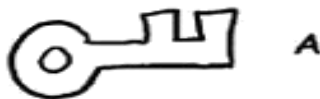

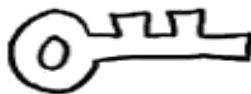
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
